## Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 3500 characters, including spaces)

Cristina Borra is Professor of Microeconomics and Labour Economics at the University of Seville (Profesora Titular de Universidad since 2017, accredited by ANECA in 2013). Her main research area is Labour and Population Economics. She has recently published two articles on children's health at the American Economic Review (JCR: 3.673) and the Journal of the European Economic Association (JCR: 2,758) in collaboration with professors González (U. Pompeu Fabra) and Sevilla (University College London). She has visited the Centre for Time Use Research of the University of Oxford on three occasions (in 2010, enjoying a José Castillejo scholarship) and the University of Cambridge, once (in 2016, enjoying a Senior Mobility scholarship). As a result of this collaboration with British professors, she has published papers in Economic Inquiry (JCR:1.031), Labour Economics (JCR: 0.919), Social Indicators Research (JCR: 1.131) and Maternal and Child Health Journal (JCR: 2.015). The paper in progress "Marriage and Housework" (with

Professor Martin Browning, University of Oxford, and Professor Sevilla, University College London) was presented at the 2017 Royal Economic Society Annual Conference.

She has also sponsored the visit of Dr. Catalina Amuedo-Dorantes (San Diego State University) to the University of Seville on several occasions, one of them with competitive funding from the Consejería de Innovación. As a result of this relationship, she has published works in the Review of Economics of the Household, the B.E. Journal of Economic Analysis and Policy, and the IZA Journal of Migration and has managed a research project funded by the Institute of Fiscal Studies.

Professor Borra has attended numerous Economics international conferences: the American Economic Association Annual Meeting in 2015, the Royal Economic Society Annual Conference in 2017, and the European Population Economics Annual Conference in 2013, to name a few. She has recently given talks in the Department of Economics from the Universidad de Alcalá, at the Population Center of the University of Maryland (USA), and at the Department of Economics of the University Pablo de Olavide. She assiduously acts as evaluator for journals such as Applied Economics, Review of Economics of the Household, Economics and Human Biology, and Social Indicators Research. Finally, she has taken part as researcher in 4 competitive R+D+I projects at the national and international level and 4 at the regional level, being the principal investigator in two of them. She has also participated in 3 research contracts, directing one as principal investigator.
